New Deputation Presentation

Our four deputation secretaries are presently arranging meetings for the work of LTBS. On past occasions these meetings have taken the form of a slide or video presentation and a fresh challenge from the word of God. Such meetings are essential for the furthering of this work. They provide up-to-date information for those who take our radio ministry upon their hearts in prayer. During 2004 a new deputation presentation has been compiled.

Commenting on the new presentation, one of our deputation secretaries, Rev. Thomas Murray of Markethill Free Presbyterian Church said, "It has always been the policy of Let the Bible Speak not to make financial appeals over the airwaves. Funds down through the years have come from gifts, covenants, and



deputation meetings. A new presentation for showing at deputation meetings was launched in February 2004. It is a PowerPoint display tracing

the history of the work from its beginnings in 1973. In those early days Rev. Alan Cairns, one of the founders of LTBS, was the sole preacher. However, with the ministry extending to Toronto in Canada and to Greenville and

Philadelphia in the United States of America, other ministers soon got involved.

"Documenting the progress of the work, [the presentation] brings us right up to date, pin pointing the various stations across the world on which we are currently broadcasting. It also takes us behind the scenes showing the making of a programme. It is a virtual who's who of LTBS, introducing us to the programme director, the various speakers, and also to those who work behind the scenes. A special word of thanks is due to Dr. Stephen McLean and Mr. John Currie for their invaluable help in





making this presentation. Those who have seen it have commented on its high quality and have been amazed at how many are involved in the work. If you would like to organise a deputation meeting for LTBS contact the programme director."

New Broadcaster

Rev. Andrew Patterson is the minister of Garvagh Free Presbyterian Church, County Londonderry, Northern Ireland. He is also the chaplain to the Coleraine campus of the University of Ulster and serves on the mission and education boards of our presbytery. Recently LTBS director Rev. Leslie Curran asked Mr. Patterson to consider contributing to the expanding radio ministry. Mr. Patterson agreed to help with weekly messages for Radio North which is based in County Donegal.

The LTBS broadcasts go out each morning Monday to Friday at 9.30 a.m. with the messages preached by Mr. Patterson being featured each Wednesday morning. Modern technology enables him to preach the messages in his own study and record them directly onto computer disc. He received invaluable help from Mr. Curran and Rev. Andrew Foster (Penticton, British Columbia, Canada) with the setting up and fine-tuning of the equipment.

Commenting on this new form of evangelism, Mr. Patterson stated, "At first it seemed strange preaching into a microphone which was linked to a computer, yet the Lord has enabled me to look beyond the screen and see the much wider picture of hundreds of potential listeners each time we preach. In the preparing of the messages I seek to keep in mind that not only are there many unsaved listening in, but also those who know the Lord and who need to be fed upon the undiluted and unadulterated word of God."

The response to the radio ministry from Garvagh has been encouraging. During one of his pastoral visits in a home for the elderly, one of the residents approached Mr. Patterson with the comment, "I recognise your voice. Are you on the radio?" As the conversation developed it became clear that this elderly Christian was listening and rejoicing in God's word as it was preached. On another occasion, Mr. Patterson received a telephone call from a lady who personally thanked him for a particular message that had just been broadcast.

In another telephone conversation, a man testified that he too was listening to the broadcasts and that through them had come to learn more of Mr. Patterson's ministry. As Mr. Patterson notes, "This is



the work of a sovereign God. It is my prayer that through the preaching of the cross and the uplifting of Christ over the airwayes, many souls will be wondrously and gloriously saved and God's people will be built up in their most holy faith." Do please continue to pray for all the contributors to LTBS radio ministry.

Possible Dublin Broadcast

Programme director Rev. Leslie Curran has been exploring the possibility of broadcasting LTBS programmes from a radio station in Dublin. The initial response from the station has been encouraging and it is hoped that details can be finalised quickly. We ask that readers remember this new opportunity in prayer. Indian Interest


